Agriculture remains a vital sector of Bangladesh’s economy, but concerns have emerged over its declining share in the national budget. In the proposed FY2026–27 budget, the allocation for agriculture and food security has increased slightly to Tk 46,821 crore, up 2.3 percent from the revised allocation of the previous fiscal year. However, as the overall national budget has expanded significantly, agriculture’s share of total government spending has fallen to 5.0 percent, the lowest level in at least a decade. This decline comes at a time when farmers are facing rising production costs, climate-related disasters, food inflation, and slower agricultural growth.

Recent data show that agricultural growth dropped to 2.42 percent in FY2024–25, the slowest rate in more than ten years. Although a slight recovery is expected, the sector’s contribution to GDP has steadily decreased over the decades. To address these challenges, the government aims to develop a self-reliant, climate-resilient, and technology-driven agricultural sector. The proposed budget focuses on making fertilisers, seeds, and irrigation more affordable, expanding farm mechanisation, introducing agricultural insurance, diversifying agricultural products, and improving cold storage facilities. It also includes measures to support fisheries and the blue economy through deep-sea fishing and seaweed cultivation.

Several tax and tariff reforms have been proposed to reduce production costs and encourage domestic manufacturing. These include tax exemptions on fertilisers and pesticides, lower import duties on selected agricultural inputs, and concessions for veterinary medicines and feed-production materials. The government expects these measures to help farmers and agricultural businesses cope with rising costs.

Despite these initiatives, many experts believe the sector faces mounting pressure. Rising global fertiliser prices have increased subsidy requirements, while flash floods and other climate-related events continue to threaten production. Some economists have expressed concern about the lack of dedicated support for flood-affected farmers and reductions in funding for water resources,

fisheries, and livestock development. Others argue that greater investment in research, advanced technology, and climate adaptation is necessary to sustain productivity growth and strengthen food security.

Agricultural specialists have also called for increased support for modern farming equipment, such as harvesters, transplanters, dryers, and milking machines. They argue that long-term, low-interest financing and greater public-private cooperation are needed to encourage innovation and help the sector adapt to environmental and economic challenges. As Bangladesh seeks to ensure food security and control inflation, the effectiveness of these policies will play an important role in shaping the future of its agricultural sector.
