4.	Read the passage and answer the following questions. Man's Landing on the Moon The moon landing is considered one of humanity's greatest achievements. On July 20, 1969, American astronaut Neil Armstrong became the first human to set foot on the moon. This historic event was part of NASA's Apollo 11 mission. Armstrong was accompanied by Buzz Aldrin, while Michael Collins piloted the command module that orbited the moon during the landing. The Apollo 11 mission was launched from <u>Kennedy</u> Space Center in Florida on July 16, 1969. The spacecraft consisted of three parts: the command module, the service module, and the lunar module. The lunar module, known as "<u>Eagle</u>," carried Armstrong and Aldrin to the moon's surface while Collins remained in orbit. When Armstrong stepped onto the lunar surface, he famously declared, "That's one small step for <u>man</u>, one giant leap for mankind." This moment was broadcast live to millions of viewers on Earth, marking a significant milestone in space exploration. The astronauts conducted experiments, collected <u>rock</u> and soil samples, and left behind a plaque that read, "We came in <u>peace</u> for all mankind." They also planted the American flag on the moon's surface. The moon landing was the culmination of years of hard work, scientific innovation, and determination. The mission was not without risks. The astronauts faced potential technical failures, the challenge of navigating in space, and the uncertainty of landing and taking off from the lunar surface. Despite these challenges, the mission was a success and paved the way for future exploration.	CLO 3

After spending 21 hours and 36 minutes on the moon, Armstrong and Aldrin returned to the lunar module and rejoined Collins in the command module. The team safely returned to Earth on <u>July</u> 24, 1969, landing in the Pacific Ocean. Their achievement inspired generations of scientists, engineers, and dreamers around the world. The moon landing remains a symbol of human ingenuity and perseverance. It demonstrated what could be achieved when nations, organizations, and individuals worked together toward a common goal. Even decades later, the Apollo 11 mission continues to captivate and inspire.
