Daffodil International University regularly organizes academic, cultural, and recreational events such as seminars, workshops, club activities, and cultural programs at venues like the University Library Auditorium, Student Lounge, and Boishakhi (Bonomaya) Cultural Zone. Due to limited seating and increasing student participation, manual event registration has become inefficient and error-prone. To address these issues, the university plans to implement an Event Booking System through the DIU mobile application.

Story :

Rima, a third-year ^{primary actor.} student of Daffodil International University, logs into the DIU mobile app using her student ID and password. After successful login, she opens the "Campus Events" section, where she can view upcoming events along with details such as event name, venue, date, time, and seat availability. Event availability is shown using color indicators where green represents available seats, yellow represents limited availability, and red indicates fully booked events. Rima selects a Tech Talk event scheduled at the Library Auditorium from 3:00 PM to 5:00 PM, chooses her preferred seat category, and confirms the booking. The ^{secondary} system then generates a confirmation message with event details and a QR code. Before the event starts, Rima receives a reminder notification. On the event day, she scans the QR code at the venue entrance to gain access to the event.

Budgeting Problem:

The university has limited funds to develop this system. They cannot implement all features at once. The development team must prioritize requirements.
