However, he is not entirely sure which principles or practices he should follow to collect and handle the data ethically and securely. 4.	On a widely used social media platform, a user publishes a comment expressing a controversial political opinion. While some members of the community perceive the post as a legitimate exercise of free expression, others report it as offensive and potentially harmful to a specific social group. The platform's content moderation team faces a complex dilemma, removing the post may be interpreted as a restriction on freedom of speech, whereas permitting it to remain could be construed as tacit endorsement of harmful or discriminatory content. The ensuing debate rapidly spreads among users, highlighting tensions between individual expression, community safety, and societal norms.
